This course of study will offer an introduction to the theory and practice of Dramatherapy at Advanced Diploma level.

Dramatherapy is a form of interactive group work and a method of play; a means of discovery, unlocking and working with different aspects of the self in a spontaneous and imaginative way. The method provides an active form of therapy that emphasizes movement, voice, characterization, embodiment and expression through drama. The focus is not on performance but on the creative process itself.

The course may be of particular interest to individuals from a variety of backgrounds including Health and Allied Health, Social Care, Community practitioners, Teachers, Theatre professionals, Therapists, Counsellors, Psychotherapists, Nursing, Psychologists etc and those individuals seeking to enhance creative approaches to working with:

- Action methods in therapy or therapeutic settings
- Creative self expression
- Enhancing self awareness
- Drama and Theatre process within a therapeutic framework

Presentation (up to 30 minutes)

Critical Reflection (2,000 words)
