

CPD Framework leading to a BSc (Hons) in Applied Health Sciences Mentorship for Assessment in Practice (Worcester) APPS3133

This module aims to prepare health and social care and welfare professionals for assessing, supporting and facilitating learning and assessment in practice. For example, successful completion is an NMC requirement for mentorship of nursing and midwifery students.

The module will give you the confidence to contribute to how the next generation of health, social care and welfare professionals are supported and shaped. It is an essential addition to your professional development.

Topics covered include: creating effective learning environments, giving feedback and supporting the "failing" student, legal aspects of assessment in practice.

Assessment

Students will be required to shadow a mentor currently assessing a student in practice and to compile a portfolio of their competence. Included in this will be items of reflection and analysis and one practical item of assessment with a student.

The course is planned in conjunction with practice facilitators and employers.

Entry criteria

Applicants must:

- Meet the requirements to assess/mentor according to their own professional body
- have at least one year of experience in professional practice
- be able to study at level 6
- have an appropriately qualified mentor and student in your workplace with whom you can work for at least part of the time.
- You must have a supervisor who is on the register of mentors and who has achieved either ENB998 or APPS3059 or APPS3133 (or another University's equivalent)
