Study options

Year 1 will introduce you to an analysis of the policies and practice of education in contemporary society as well as giving you the opportunity to investigate issues such as education and inequality, teaching and learning and inner city education. Your studies in Years 2 and 3 will then develop your understanding of the subject through a programme of research and enquiry. You will be encouraged to select modules according to your own needs and interests, so that a coherent programme of study can be achieved. A pathway in Inclusive Education is also available. It is also possible to study a semester abroad.
