Information for students studying joint subjects

Students studying joint subjects will have two timetables: one for each subject. Obviously some of these sessions may clash and you may therefore not be able to attend every session.

Do not worry about not being able to attend every session, attend what you can and choose the sessions that you think will be of most use to you. You must, however, attend your course information sessions for both subjects.

The majority of subjects have a repeat session scheduled for joint subject students on Friday morning. This means that you should be able to attend the information session for both subjects.

Academic Tutors

You will be assigned an Academic Tutor at the beginning of your course. This is a member of academic staff who will provide academic assistance and guidance during your studies and will usually be one of the people teaching on your course. If you are studying on a joint degree, you will be assigned two tutors.

You should have already received confirmation of your tutor and can normally expect to meet them sometime during Welcome Week.

Building names and room numbers

It is very common for new students to worry about finding buildings and rooms. At first the University sites can appear confusing, but please be assured that within a very short time you will become familiar with building names and locations. To assist you, room layout plans are located in Edward Elgar (EE), Binyon (BY) and the Sports Centre (SC).

The University prides itself on being a welcoming and friendly institution. During Welcome Week staff have been encouraged to wear a 'Here to Help' badge. If you are lost, or not sure of where to go, please approach them for help.

Information for students living in University-managed accommodation

If you will be living in University-managed accommodation or halls of residence, either on or off campus, you **MUST** attend an induction session as part of your enrolment as a student of the University.

During the session you will be guided through the health and safety rules for your halls of residence and given a brief introduction to what you can expect from living in University-managed accommodation; from the role of the cleaners and how to contact Security, to how to survive and enjoy communal living. You will also hear what will be expected of you in terms of personal behaviour, and your responsibilities in respect of the licence agreement.

These **compulsory** sessions will take place on **Sunday 18 September**. Please refer to the list below to find the time and location of the session for your halls of residence. **Each session will last approximately 45 minutes and a register will be taken of students attending.** Please make sure you arrive in good time so that your session can begin promptly.

Information for students moving into private rented accommodation

Study skills support

The University offers a wide range of study skills support to all undergraduate students. There is a designated website www.worcester.ac.uk/studyskills and study skills advice sheets are available from Peirson Library and the Careers Centre in Woodbury Building.

Basic I.T. sessions are being held on Tuesday 27 September from 13.15-14.15pm and Thursday 29 September 12.15-13.15pm for any student unfamiliar with I.T. Study skill sessions on topics such as essay writing, taking notes, presentations and critical analysis are offered throughout the academic year with sessions in the daytime as well as during the evening. In addition, for new students, there are three study skills days. These are on Monday 26, Thursday 29 and Friday 30 September. Each day will cover topics such as 'Starting your studies', 'Academic reading and writing' and 'Time Management'. As a new student you will receive a copy of the Student Workshops booklet during Welcome Week. 'A listening ear'

This is a service offered by the Counselling Team to allow students experiencing difficulties a space to be heard. The purpose of the sessions is to offer a safe and confidential place to talk over any concerns that you may have with your transition to university. It will run for three weeks; from Monday 19 September until Friday 7 October. Two 30 minute sessions will be offered each day and these can be booked via the Student Enquiry Desk in Woodbury or directly from the Counselling and Mental Health Service.

Institute of Education

The induction process into your chosen studies starts with Welcome Week in September. This will give you opportunities to get to know the staff and other students, in both academic and social settings, as well as introducing you to your course and to the wide range of student services available on campus. You will also be introduced to the Personal Development Plan schemes which you will develop with your tutor's support throughout your studies and which are designed, among other things, to increase your employability.

Of course, there is lots of information for you to digest during induction and so with that in mind, our induction process continues throughout the first semester and beyond. You will find that some of the activities that you engage with in the induction week will be carried on into your module teaching sessions. As well as this, staff from the Information and Learning Services take an integral part in some of the modules in semester one. This, together with the guidance from your Academic Tutor, who is there to help you throughout your time with us, will give you the support that you need as you develop into an effective undergraduate student.
