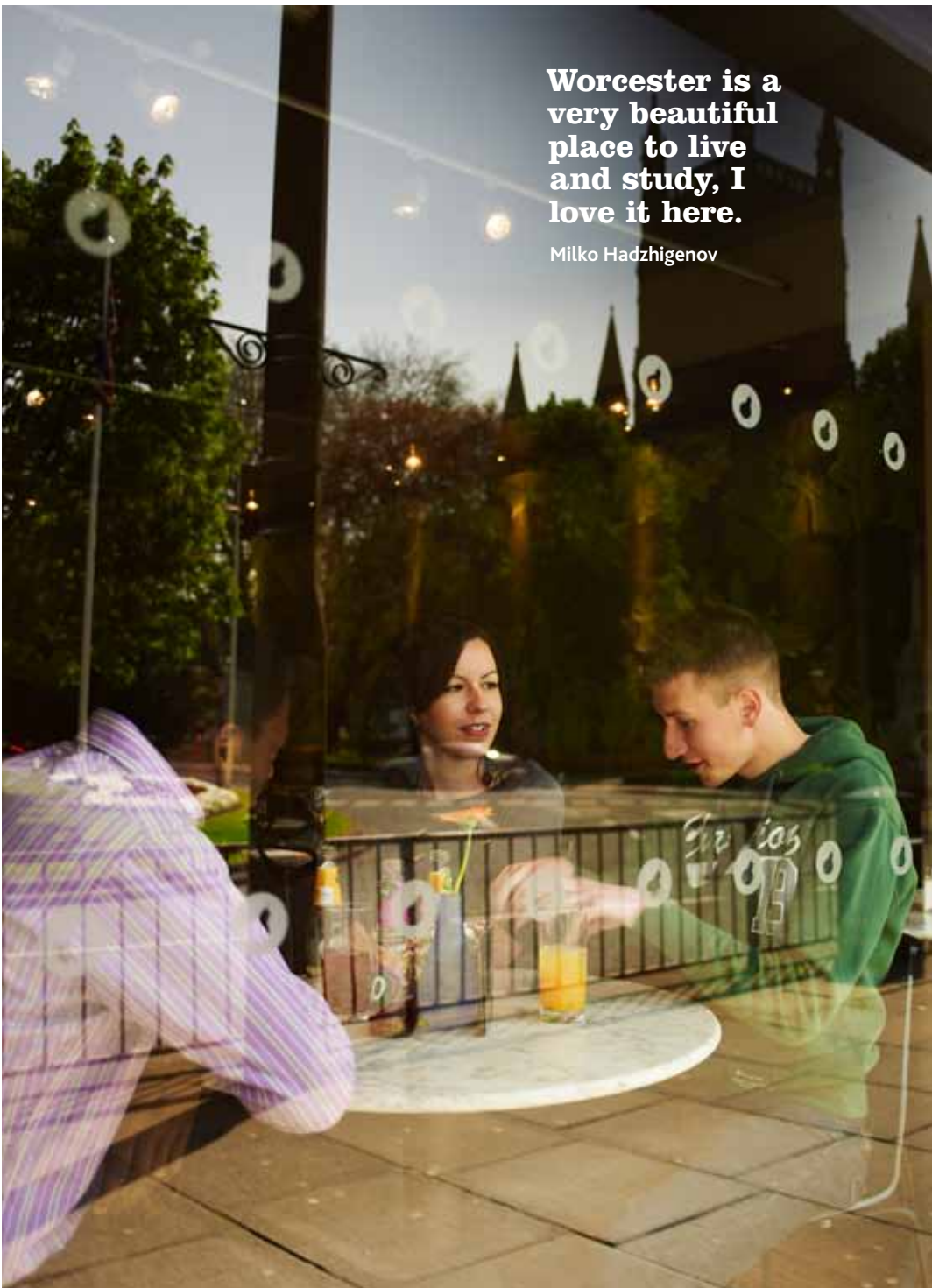

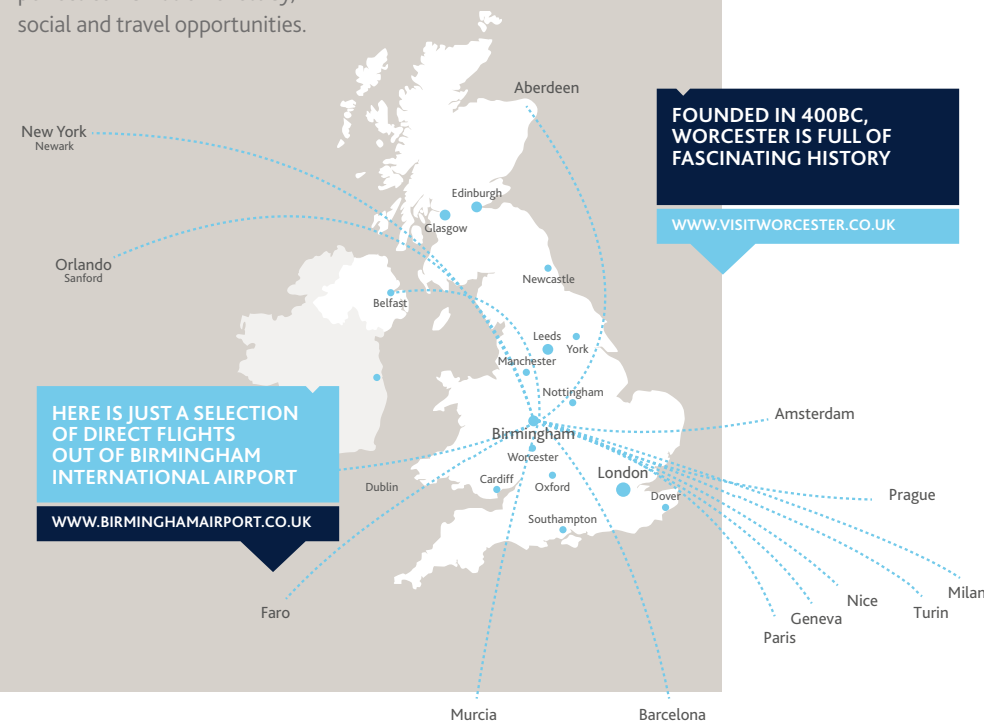

St John's is a green parkland campus while the City Campus is a grand conversion of the former Royal Infirmary. 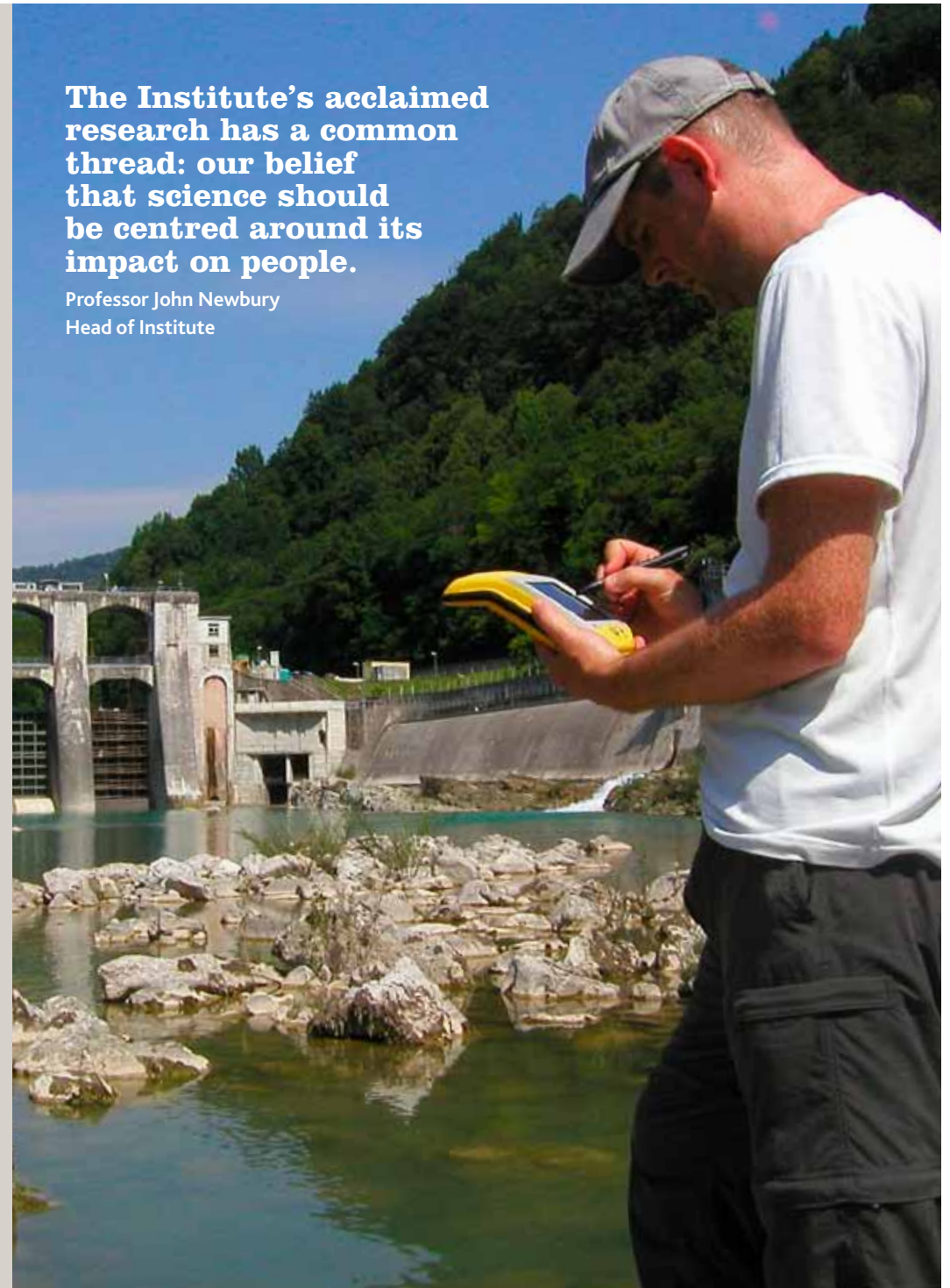

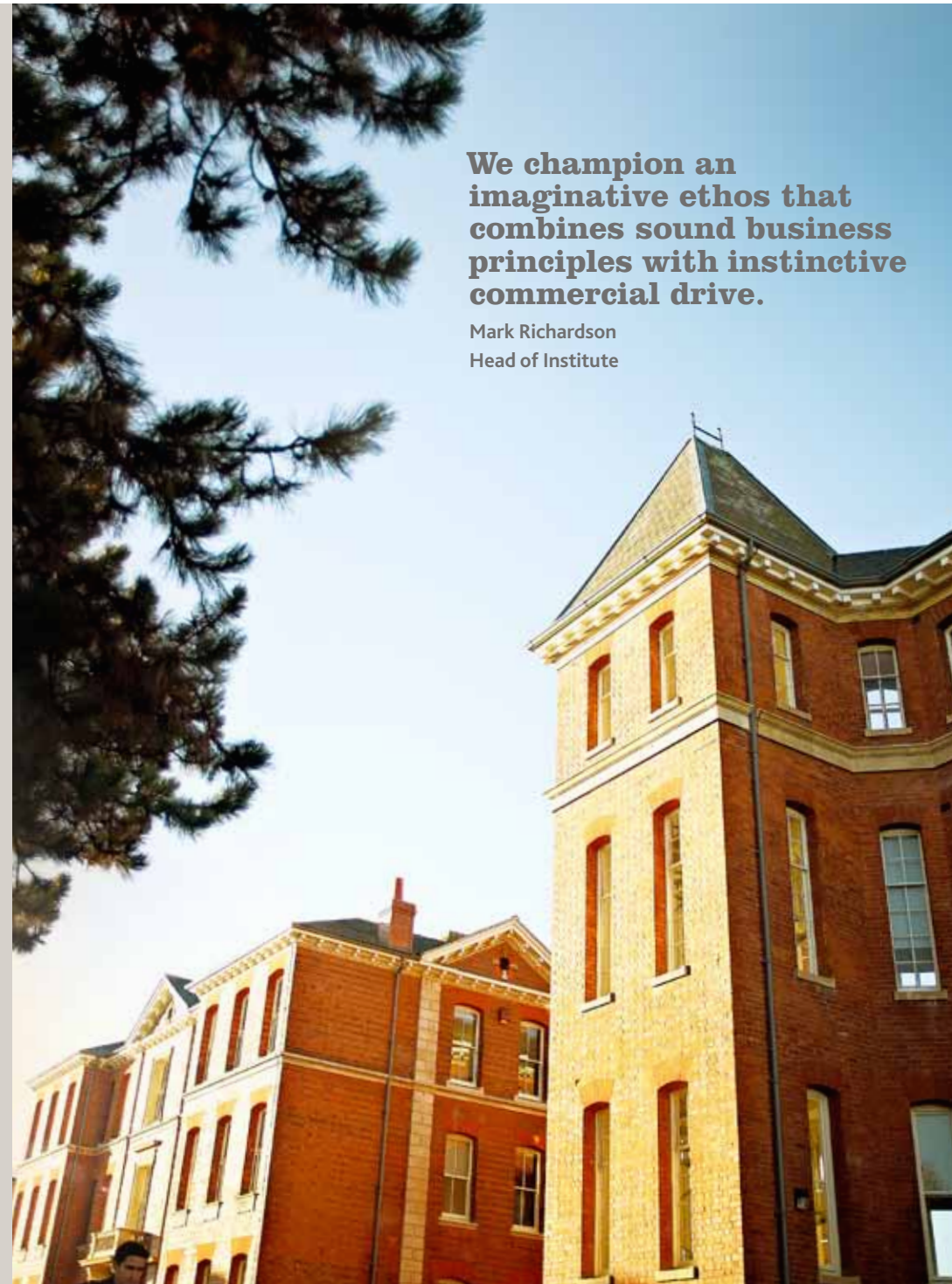
