Advanced Clinical Practice Capability

MACP4013

This module is launched at the beginning of the course and runs alongside the whole MSc; the aim is to ensure that upon completion, practitioners have achieved the NHSE (2017) capabilities for advanced clinical practice. The NHSE framework sets safe and effective requirements for advanced clinical practice, whilst allowing for local context in relation to how the principles are implemented.

Practitioners will develop and evidence the underpinning competencies applicable to their specialty or subject area, i.e. the knowledge, skills and behaviours relevant to their setting and job role. The core capabilities across the four pillars - clinical practice, leadership and management, education and research are then applied to these specialist competencies. These may be developed and demonstrated in varying ways specific to the profession, role, population group, setting and sector.

At the beginning of the module students will undertake an individual learning needs analysis, based on the requirements of their trainee ACP role, setting and scope of practice. This analysis will be undertaken in association with their clinical supervisor, manager and Personal Academic tutor to create an individualised learning contract.

As ACPs need to develop generic knowledge and skills as well as specific skills based on their role, setting and scope, learning and teaching strategies in other modules will reflect this by offering generic teaching as well as two specialist pathways through the course e.g. adult focused assessment and child focused assessment.

Students will develop an e-Portfolio using Pebble Pad, which includes the Capability Document. This will be submitted at the end of the Post Graduate Diploma (before the MSc Dissertation), to demonstrate completion of their learning contract signed by a Clinical Supervisor, their Manager and Personal Academic Tutor.
