Advanced Adult Health Assessment

You will normally be expected to do Challenging and Enhancing Services as your first module to enable you to make the best of your MSc studies.

Holistic health assessment is one of the cornerstones of advanced clinical practice and comprises physical, psychological, cognitive, lifestyle, social and domestic elements. A comprehensive, valid and reliable patient assessment underpins the complex clinical decision making required of the advanced practitioner. This module ventures beyond the traditional medical model of physical examination to explore assessment from a much more integrated approach. The module aims to teach the principles of a valid and reliable patient assessment and equip the health care professional with the know-how in order to advance the boundaries of clinical practice within a professional, legal and ethical framework.

Students are required to identify a suitable clinical mentor to support them in their clinical environment to achieve the learning outcomes. In addition to the university contact days there is a required clinical component of a minimum of 78 hours to be spent practicing skills in clinical practice. Students need to be confident their work environment will support access to a range of specialities for clinical practice. Further information may be sought from the module lead.

Assessment:

Achievement of competencies in clinical practice, assessed by a mentor with a supporting portfolio of evidence including 2 written case studies amounting to 4000 words. One 30 minute observed, structured clinical assessment.
