

Health and Social Needs Assessment for Advanced Clinical Practice MACP4022

Advanced assessment skills sit at the heart of advanced practice. Practitioners working at an advanced level draw on a wide range of assessment methods, synthesising clinical, psychological, social, and contextual information to support safe, person-centred decision-making. This module prepares students to develop and apply advanced assessment and diagnostic reasoning skills relevant to their role, scope, and professional context.

The module aligns with the Clinical Pillar of the Multi-Professional Framework for Advanced Practice (NHSE 2025) and supports learners from a range of professions, including those undertaking the MSc Advanced Clinical Practice, the Advanced Clinical Practice Apprenticeship (ACPA), or studying the module as a standalone option.

Students undertaking the full MSc will also complete MACP4013, and evidence generated within MACP4022 can be mapped across modules to avoid duplication.

Assessment:

1. Clinical Portfolio (Pass/Fail): Minimum 72 hours supervised clinical practice, reflective entries, evidence of reasoning, supervisor sign-off.
2. Professional Discussion (100%): 40-minute discussion based on a complex case; written overview submitted one week prior; justification of assessment and reasoning; examiner questions on risk, evidence, and judgement. No compensation between components.
