Preventing sexual violence in schools: curriculum responses

Schools must act robustly to protect pupils from sexual harassment and violence, and online sexual abuse. Concerns round children's safety following a prolonged period of remote and online learning and developments in PSHE curricula are now reflected in school inspection frameworks.

Main Foci

This session will focus on the role of curriculum in preventing peer on peer sexual abuse. We will explore how PSHE, Personal Development and a wider school curriculum can inform and support pupils and students to ensure that they feel safe.

Teaching around consent, relationships and sex education as well as protected characteristics will be a key focus of the day and the sessions will include opportunities for discussion, reviewing lessons and resources as well as time for reflection and planning next steps.

The course is open to **staff from a range of settings and age phases**, from early years to further education.

Participating in this event will give attendees access to **one further CPD course** to extend, enhance and develop their work to prevent sexual violence in schools. In **March 2023**, we will examine cultural responses to leadership of school safeguarding practice.
