

# Exploring and Challenging Advanced Clinical Practice

## MACP4001

This module is the first mandatory module for the MSc Advanced Clinical Practice. It introduces students to Level 7 study and provides context and foundational knowledge for all other modules in the MSc degree. It enables students to explore principles, theories and concepts of advanced clinical practice capabilities including critical thinking, service improvement, and leading change.

Students will build an advanced and critical understanding of the political and policy context of 21st century health care, including analysis of system and place. Students will strengthen awareness and understanding of their own learning and development needs, to affect change at individual, team and organisational level.

Content will include:


- Level 7 academic writing, critical appraisal and critical thinking
- Policy and political context for Advanced Clinical Practice
- Principles and practice of quality improvement, change management and leadership for Advanced Clinical Practice.
