The Pack for Good campaign launched in 2012, since then we have grown to service over 100 universities, 15 councils, over 300 local private student accommodation providers and have successfully rolled out six national partnerships across the UK.

The campaign aims to reduce complexity whilst actively contributing to waste diversion, carbon reduction targets and CSR targets including charitable giving within your communities.

2021 Pack for Good Campaign

Pack for Good & Covid-19

This last two years have been challenging for the pack for good campaign with coronavirus, Covid-19 resulting in a national lockdown ahead of the launch of the 2020 campaign and second/third lockdowns continuing into the 2021 academic year.

In the face of the complexities around Covid-19 all our amazing partners (you) have continued to collect and store donations from students throughout this time supporting our ongoing partnerships.

In April 2021 the university team returned to work to support our partners in successfully launching the 2021 campaign.

Despite the unknown student numbers and changes to campaigns across the country I am delighted to report that the 2021 campaign has raised a staggering $\mathfrak{L}1.7m$ this year.

We would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank you all for your support during these challenging two campaign years.

We look forward to continuing our work together with an ambitious target of raising £4.7m in 2022, to get back to our much needed levels of donations for our shops and stores.





We estimate that a bag of donations from a student could be worth as much as £14.

10 bags could nurse a broken heart by funding a full day's BHF Heart Nursing care. In this time a Heart Nurse could care for up to six patients to help them manage their condition and prevent further hospital re-admissions.

100 bags could help find a cure by funding one of our young scientists for seven days. We currently provide the salaries for around 500 post-doctoral scientists who work in research team's right across the UK on projects to better understand how to diagnose, prevent, treat and cure heart disease.

1000 bags could help 40 young heart patients to gain independence, new skills and confidence whilst meeting other young heart patients.



new developments and emerging scientists in a heart failure research lab and buy major items of equipment to support their research.





Heart and circulatory diseases kill 1 in 4 people in the UK. They cause heartbreak on every street. We fund research into all heart and circulatory diseases and their risk factors. Heart attacks, heart failure, stroke, vascular dementia, diabetes and many more. All connected, all under our microscope. Our research is the promise of future prevention, cures and treatments.

University Funding





From Edinburgh to Cardiff, Belfast to London, we are supporting research projects but also strategic investments including the Centres of Research Excellence, Centres of Regenerative Medicine, the BHF Data Science Centre and Accelerator Awards.

All heart and circulatory diseases and their risk factors, we currently support over £440m of life saving research across 49 institutions in the UK to better understand, prevent, and treat heart and circulatory diseases.

Dom's Story

Dom Davies was born with a complex, life-threatening heart condition and underwent his first heart surgery when he was just four days old.

"I was always aware that I was different but this became more evident to me when I would see other kids at playgroup. All the other kids were running around being kids and I couldn't join in or keep up because I was breathless all the time and much slower."

But in 2015, at the age of 17, his heart condition started to deteriorate rapidly and it became difficult to even catch a breath. This was when Dom was told he needed a new heart.

Thankfully Dom was given the good news that he was on the transplant waiting list for a new heart in late 2017 and received his life saving transplant in early months of 2019. A gift that has given him a completely new lease of life.

Host an Event, Volunteer, Fundraise


BHF Pop up Shop on campus


